

SCT Jr. 2021 Student and Parent Contract

The following expectations must be read and agreed upon by both parent(s)/guardian(s) and students. This contract, along with the registration form, will act as our emergency form and release forms. To download a copy of this contract, visit <https://sctlivetheatre.com/youth-programs/>

- Class/rehearsal and performances will all be held both **online** via Google Classroom, Google Meet, Zoom and Podcast and **in-person**, following COVID safety protocols at Stockton Civic Theatre.
- Students must attend all rehearsals outside of conflicts previously agreed upon by SCT Jr. staff. Students may only miss two class sessions between June 21 and July 15. Students may **not** miss any rehearsals from July 19 to the final day of filming on July 25. More than two absences will result in dismissal from the program. (Additionally, three unexcused tardies will be counted as one absence). In the case of a necessary absence, a parent or student must call/text Director John Thiel prior to rehearsal.
- Parents will provide a device (Computer, Laptop, or Chromebook) and a means to connect to the Internet in order to use and access the online program. For additional internet support please visit <https://wifi.xfinity.com>.

Stockton Civic Theatre is not equipped to supervise students' online activity. We recommend that parents/guardians supervise all activity. Some useful resources include:

- Students must demonstrate respect for all staff and fellow students and behave in a supportive manner during online and in-person rehearsals. If any student exhibits disruptive behavior, which is distracting to the class, including verbal abuse, profanity, or vandalism, the following will occur:
 - 1 SCT Staff will first speak with the student.
 - 2 SCT Staff will talk to the parent or guardian.
 - 3 If the negative behavior does not stop, the student will be removed from the program.
- Cyber-bullying and physical aggression by any student or adult will result in automatic expulsion without warning and without refund.
- Cell phones and other electronic devices are not to be seen nor heard at any time during the class sessions, rehearsals, and performances. Students should keep their devices on silent and away so as to not distract the instruction.

- ❑ Due to licensing contracts and agreements with guest artists, the following are prohibited: screen recording or taking of images, sharing of any instructional materials, and sharing secure and private links with others outside of the SCT Jr. 2021 Summer Program. If any of these contracts and agreements are breached, you may be held responsible for any fees or fines that are accrued due to your actions.
- ❑ All students must dress in appropriate attire for all live online instruction and in-person rehearsals. Close-toed shoes are required for all rehearsals held at Stockton Civic Theatre.
- ❑ Students and parents will be required to abide by all COVID-19 safety protocols put in place by Stockton Civic Theatre and/or its representatives including but not limited to temperature checks, mask wearing, hand-washing and sanitizing, and physical distancing measures on and off stage.
- ❑ Students may only be in teacher supervised, designated areas of the theatre and may only eat or drink during supervised breaks in designated areas. All students must keep theatre spaces neat and clean. Garbage and recyclables must be disposed of in appropriate cans.
- ❑ Students must behave in a quiet and mature manner at Stockton Civic Theatre: in the rehearsal hall, theatre, hallways, lobby, and any public area where classes, rehearsals or performances are held. In other words: No running.
- ❑ Stockton Civic Theatre is not equipped to supervise children after hours. Students are expected to be picked up no later than 15 minutes after the class session has ended.
